A short Glossary

CFU credit system

- CFU, Credito Formativo Universitario
- 1 CFU = 25 hours (10 teaching hours)

Example:

A course with 6 CFU means that you will have to be 60 hours in the classroom for direct teaching; the remaining hours are related to the personal study time)

Note: Courses may have 6, 9 or 12 CFU





The university grading system in Italy

The Italian university grading system for exams is based on a 30- point scale (18 and above is considered passing). A 110-point scale is used to grade the final dissertation (66 is the minimum grade necessary to graduate).

The *Cum Laude* is equivalent to the mention "with honours" and is assigned to praise outstanding students for each exam and/or upon completion of their university degree.

The Faculty's main headquarter is on Colle Oppio in via Eudossiana, but the educational and scientific activities are also carried out in other locations in Rome.

How to reach Sapienza Main Campus from the Faculty

By underground

- \rightarrow go to the stop CAVOUR
- → take the **B line** (Rebibbia Direction, 3 stops)
- → get off at POLICLINICO
- → walk 700 meters to Viale Regina Elena 295

(approx: 15 min)

By tramcar

- → go to the stop COLOSSEO
- → take the **3 Line** (Valle Giulia Direction) for 13 stops
- → get off at UNIVERSITA' LA SAPIENZA

(approx: 25 min.)





Attendance of lessons

Students do not have to enroll for courses to attend lectures. Once lessons begin, just go to the lecture hall and attend the lesson.



Attendance is usually not mandatory (but highly suggested in any case)

Some Professors may ask you to sign an attendance sheet to keep track of the students who attend lessons regularly. Moreover, the course load may vary slightly depending on whether or not you attend the lessons. Some professors may ask students who do not attend lessons to integrate their course work with an extra or a different textbook to balance the workload for all students. Textbook requirements and related information for each course are listed on each Professor personal page.



InfoStud is an IT tool adopted by Sapienza, created for students in order to simplify a wide range of operations related to their status.

Through it, in fact, it becomes possible to enroll, book exams, monitor the verbalizations of the marks, print certificates and view your career.





INFOSTUD 2.0 is accessible from the "STUDENTS" section of the Sapienza website.





Once you are logged in, click on "Bachelors and Masters Degree Programmes"





As an Erasmus student, you can only use the system to enroll for exams: InfoStud is not needed to subscribe to courses. You will not see any official career connected with your profile, because you are an exchange student.

Professors publish the exam dates a couple of months before the exam session starts.

In order to take exams, you must book on-line via the InfoStud student portal. You can book an exam from one month to one week before the exam date.

Most exams are oral, although some may also have a written part.



Once the exam is booked, remember to print your receipt, as you will need to present it and have it signed by your Professor.

Remember to hold on to it as final proof of your exam.
