Did you know that


80% of the student participants found employment within 3 months after graduation. 72% claimed to have found a job as a result of their international experience!!!

What is the Erasmus+ programme?



Erasmus+ stands as the European Union initiative dedicated to education, training, youth, and sports, operational for the duration of 2021-2027.

Under Erasmus+, students have the opportunity to embark on a 2-12 months academic journey at one of our Faculty's Partner Universities across Europe. Refer to the Call's Destination Table for a comprehensive list of available destinations.

A total of approximately <u>427 scholarships</u> are earmarked within the Faculty, covering various fields of study.



Students can carry out the Erasmus + mobility for a total period that does not exceed **12 months** for each study cycle (Bachelor's, Master's, PhD programmes)

Eligible activities are:

- Attendance of learning activities (courses) and passing of the related assessment tests (exams);
- Preparation of the **degree** or **doctoral thesis**

The EU Contribution is governed by the guidelines of the new Erasmus program (2021/2027). It varies based on the nature of the mobility, whether it is a Long mobility or Short mobility for PhD students, and is tied to the cost of living in the destination country.

Programme Countries

GROUP 1 = HIGH cost of living: 350 euros per month Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Netherlands, Sweden

GROUP 2 = MEDIUM cost of living: 300 euros per month Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Latvia, Malta, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Bulgaria, Croatia, Lithuania, Poland, North Macedonia, Romania, Serbia, Turkey, Hungary **SAPIENZA ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION**

MUR ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION (based on the economic condition, ISEE)

GREEN TRAVEL GRANT

MUR contributions will not be paid to students who are enrolled after the first year onwards the regular duration of degree programme (fuori corso) Students who do not obtain the recognition of at least 12 CFUs at the end of their mobility period, will be required to fully refund the MUR grant. In case of mobility for "thesis research" only, CFUs must be no less than 3.



General Requirements:

 Students should have obtained at least 6 CFUs credits in their enrolled program <u>by the application deadline</u> (for students enrolled in the Master's in Civil Engineering, applications can be submitted even without recorded CFUs).



Erasmus+ Language Requirements 1/3

Is it mandatory a language certificate to apply?

Yes:

-To apply to the Call, a minimum level of linguistic proficiency, at least equal to level A2, of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) recognized by the Council of Europe https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-europeanframework-reference-languages

– linguistic competence must be demonstrated for the language in which the teaching activity will mainly take place



Erasmus+ Language Requirements

Is it mandatory to take the CLA test ?

Yes, each candidate, <u>before concluding the online application</u>, must take the language assessment test(s) at the CLA.

However the following exemptions appy (see Article 5.3.1):

- native speaker of the language chosen for the mobility;
- bilingual where the second language is the one chosen for the purposes of mobility;
- enrolled in study programs entirely taught in English (*if English is the language required for the purposes of the mobility*);
- who obtained a high school diploma from an international high school recognized by the MUR;
- that passed the CLA test for the Erasmus call last year;
- in possess of an A2 language certificate released by specific institutions;
- who obtained a certificate released (minimum A2) by an host University during a mobility performed last year.



Erasmus+ Language Requirements

I am assigned an Erasmus destination. Is the language certificate mandatory to <u>leave</u>?

That is up to the Partner University

- As a rule, Partner Institutions require a minimum level of language proficiency:
- In some cases they require an official certificate
- In other cases, they settled for self-certifications or unofficial certificates
- The language certificate must be obtained within the deadline set by the **Partner Institution** (see Partner University's website).

ATTENTION:

- In any case, <u>the student</u> is responsible for achieving the language requirement required by the Host Institution within the set times (<u>see website!</u>)
- The Host Institution may refuse to accept a student who does not have the required language level, even if he/she is awarded the Erasmus scholarship.

Erasmus+ Before the Application

The complete list of destinations and all related information, including specific language and academic requirements (the degree programs that provide access), can be viewed on the destinations portal (https://goerasmus.web.uniroma1.it/)

- 1. Find the destinations available and **pertinent** to your Degree course
- **2. Check** the Academic Offer on the websites of the respective Partner Universities.
- **3. Contact** the RAM of your degree course to get advise on the list of exams to be included in the "preliminary study plan" requested for the application



Erasmus+ Final Project during the Mobility

Can I work on my Final Project during the mobility?

Yes. Students/doctoral candidates intending to conduct thesis research or laboratory activities related to thesis preparation must indicate the following in the application: subject, supervisor, topic, whether the project has been approved by the thesis supervisor, expected credit evaluation, and the name of the contact professor at the host university (for each mobility option selected).

The dissertation and the graduation take place in Italy.



a) Academic Merit: 0 – 50 points

The score for academic merit will be evaluated based on study regularity and academic performance. The factors contributing to the calculation of the score for academic merit include the weighted average (arithmetic average for medical degree programs) of grades, compared to the weighted average of the student's degree program, and the number of credits earned in relation to the total number of credits required for the year of enrollment 14 in the current cycle.

b) Evaluation of preliminary learning projects: 0 - 50 points

The score will be based on consistency of the educational projects with exams present in the academic study plan (40 points) and adequacy of CFUs (credits) in relation to the period of mobility abroad (10 points)



SELECTION CRITERIA

If this path was completed outside of Sapienza University, the candidate must provide the relevant documentation to the committee. For the calculation of the score, the data from the student's academic career up to the application deadline will be considered according to the following formula: Average (ratio of weighted average grade to the weighted average grade of the program) x 30 +(plus) Total CFUs (ratio of earned CFUs to total CFUs required in the program for the year the student is enrolled) x 20 - (minus) 1 point for each year beyond the legal duration of the program.



PAY ATTENTION TO PRIORITIES!!!

Students can apply **up to 5 destinations** for Erasmus. It is compulsory to specify <u>what the priority order is.</u>

The order of priorities will be a **binding criterion** for the assignment of the destination.
