Why having an international experience?

An international experience is a once-in-a-life experience to:


- improve your language skills
- broaden your views
- enrich your CV
- appreciate other cultures
- ▶ ...

Did you know that

80% of the student participants found employment within 3 months after graduation. 72% claimed to have found a job as a result of their international experience!!!

Results suggest that the Erasmus experience is associated with an increase in cognitive cultural intelligence, soft skills, and desire for an international career. (*Deardoff, 2006*).

What is the Erasmus+ programme?

Enriching lives, opening minds through the EU programme for education, training, youth and sport **Erasmus+** stands as the European Union initiative dedicated to education, training, youth, and sports, operational for the duration of 2021-2027.

Under Erasmus+, students have the opportunity to embark on a 2-12 months academic journey at one of our Faculty's Partner Universities across Europe. Refer to the Call's Destination Table for a comprehensive list of available destinations.

A total of approximately <u>427 scholarships</u> are earmarked within the Faculty, covering various fields of study.



Students can carry out the Erasmus + mobility for a total period that does not exceed **12 months** for each study cycle (Bachelor's, Master's, PhD programmes)

Eligible activities are:

- Attendance of learning activities (courses) and passing of the related assessment tests (exams);
- Preparation of the **degree** or **doctoral thesis**

The EU Contribution is governed by the guidelines of the new Erasmus program (2021/2027). It varies based on the nature of the mobility, whether it is a Long mobility or Short mobility for PhD students, and is tied to the cost of living in the destination country.

Programme Countries

GROUP 1 = cost of living HIGH:

Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden -> **350,00 euros per month**

GROUP 2 = cost of living MEDIUM:

Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Malta, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain -> **300,00 euros per month**

GROUP 3 = cost of living LOW:

Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Turkey, Hungary -> **250,00 euros per month** **SAPIENZA ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION**

MUR ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION (based on the economic condition, ISEE)

GREEN TRAVEL GRANT

MUR contributions will not be paid to students who are enrolled after the first year onwards the regular duration of degree programme (fuori corso) Students who do not obtain the recognition of at least 12 CFUs at the end of their mobility period, will be required to fully refund the MUR grant. In case of mobility for "thesis research" only, CFUs must be no less than 3.



Erasmus+ Academic Requirements

In addition to the General Requirements:

- GPA at least 23;
- Students should have acquired a number of CFUs in excess of 1/5 of those acquired up to the expiry date of the Call;
- Students should have acquired a minimum of 9 ects if enrolled in the first year of a Master's Degree (except for students enrolled in the Master's Degree in Civil Engineering)



Is it mandatory a language certificate to apply?

Yes:

-To apply to the Call, a minimum level of linguistic proficiency, at least equal to level A2, of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) recognized by the Council of Europe https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-europeanframework-reference-languages

– linguistic competence must be demonstrated for the language in which the teaching activity will mainly take place



Is it mandatory to take the CLA test?

Yes, each candidate, <u>before concluding the online</u> <u>application</u>, must take the language assessment test(s) at the CLA.

Are **exempted** students:

- native speaker of the language chosen for the mobility
- bilingual where the second language is the one chosen for the purposes of mobility
- enrolled in study programmes entirely taught in English (*if English is the language required for the purposes of the mobility*)
- who obtained a high school diploma from an international high school recognized by the MUR



I am assigned an Erasmus destination. Is the language certificate mandatory <u>to leave</u>?

That is up to the Partner University

- As a rule, Partner Institutions require a minimum level of language proficiency:
- In some cases they require an official certificate
- In other cases, they settled for self-certifications or unofficial certificates
- The language certificate must be obtained within the deadline set by the Partner Institution (see Partner University's website).

ATTENTION:

- In any case, <u>the student</u> is responsible for achieving the language requirement required by the Host Institution within the set times (<u>see website!</u>)
- The Host Institution may refuse to accept a student who does not have the required language level, even if he/she is awarded the Erasmus scholarship.



Erasmus+ Before the Application

Find the destinations available and <u>pertinent to your</u> <u>Degree course.</u>

Check the Academic Offer on the websites of the respective Partner Universities.

Agree with the **RAM** on the training project ("Proposal of Learning Agreement" form)

ATTENTION: Proposals of Learning Agreement containing less than 18 cfu per semester to be recognized, will not be taken into consideration (except proposals to carry out thesis activities)



Can I work on my Final Project during the mobility?

Yes.

It is <u>mandatory</u> to already have a Supervisor (*Docente Relatore*) in Sapienza

The «Proposal of Learning Agreement» should be signed by **both your RAM and your Supervisor**

During the Erasmus mobility, the student prepares his thesis work. For this activity, **a part** of the credits reserved for the thesis are directly recognized.

The dissertation and the graduation take place in Italy



Academic Merit: 0 - 100 points

Up to 50 points to the fraction of **credits** obtained within the application delivery and recorded in InfoStud within the deadline of the call, compared to the expected credits according to the latest Study Plan approved, at the end of the first semester 2023/2024;

Up to 50 points to the fraction in thirtieth of the **average grade**, normalized to the average grade of the course of study, of the exams verbalized within the application delivery and recorded in Infostud within the deadline of the call. The credits and the year of registration will be weighted (reducing the average grade of examinations of students out-of-course and repeating students of one thirtieth per year off and repeating year);

The order of priorities will be a binding criterion for the assignment of the destination.
